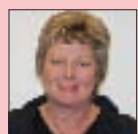

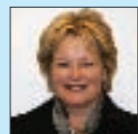

# MorganClarke - Our City, Your Council



## Rates – Financial Management

- 5% reduction in rates achieved in part by stopping the money spent on State Government Projects eg. \$40million grant for Convention Centre
- Review the 'Rating' system. Melbourne is the only Council using a 'Rental' based system (NAV). We need the best system in order to reduce our rates
- Surpluses need to be achieved in order to stop the drain on the currently reducing Melbourne investment funds
- Better Value. We will run an Audit of Council systems to remove waste and better deliver services



## Good Governance and Electoral Reform

- Call for an Independent comprehensive objective review to determine the best governance and electoral system for Melbourne
- Restore full planning powers to the City Council
- Council must control all planning decisions including Docklands
- Appoint Councillors to take responsibility for Precincts i.e. Carlton, Docklands, Kensington, etc

## Safe City

- Double the existing CCTV camera coverage in the CBD, Docklands and Southbank to remove black spots and assist policing
- Pressure State Government to increase Police numbers patrolling our streets
- Extend current Safe City Taxi ranks from 3 to 10 locations
- Review Liquor Licensing and Planning Control to disperse venue locations and improve enforcement of permit conditions



## Sustainability and Environment

- Drought-proof our parks by 'Sewer mining' and 'Water harvesting'
- Use environmentally friendly street lighting globes
- Provide more and safer bike lanes
- Create rate incentives for business and residential consumers to adopt energy minimisation systems
- Extend pedestrian zones on Swanston Street



## Transport

- Upgrade Flinders St Station in collaboration with State Government to world class standards respecting the heritage building, enclosing the platforms and creating a retail, hotel, tourism precinct
- Implement growth in 'Bikes as Transport' strategy
- Promote 'Park and Drive' options on perimeter of City to reduce commuter traffic
- Reduce infiltration of commuter traffic in residential streets
- Review and up-grade resident permit parking system

## Carlton

- Stop the Eddington Road Tunnel to stem traffic funnelling off the Freeway to the CBD
- Build centrally located community centre and library in Kathleen Syme Centre
- Expand street tree planting scheme
- Increase focus on retail precinct planning including Lygon, Faraday and Elgin Streets
- Address international student housing issues – quality and services
- Maintain heritage protection of buildings and garden environments



## Docklands

- Stop the Webb Dock Rail Bridge below the Bolte – Tunnel is the ONLY option
- Ban skateboarding in residential and business precincts
- Build permanent community centre, sports precinct and library
- Expand green open space
- Implement and activate waterways strategy
- Encourage Spirit of Tasmania to berth in Docklands, increasing visitation by 1 million visitors per annum

## Kensington

- Stop the loss of Holland Park by stopping the Eddington Road Tunnel
- Upgrade weekly street cleaning and capital works program commensurate with the rest of Melbourne
- Upgrade Melrose Street Shopping Centre



## Parkville

- Implement effective traffic control measures in Gatehouse Street to reduce through traffic
- Fix road markings in Parkville Gardens and improve street lighting

## North and West Melbourne

- No extension of parking meters in Errol Street
- Expand street tree planting and green space
- Upgrade North Melbourne library
- Fix Resident Parking Scheme particularly in Queensberry Street



## Southbank

- Increase the green space by land acquisition or planning control strategies
- Fully consult and review strategy on the Boyd School site to retain 2/3 for usable open space and create community centre, library including childcare
- Upgrade vacant land on Whiteman Street to usable open space
- Implement Southbank development plan

## South Yarra / East Melbourne / Jolimont

- Upgrade and drought-proof all our precious parks and gardens
- Remove council depots from parks and return to green space
- Review heritage controls to maintain quality of historic precincts
- Reduce through traffic from residential areas
- Improve provision of library services for South Yarra
